

Addrian Ferraire, Junior Mount Saint Michael Academy, the Bronx

How did the decision to go to Catholic school come about?

My parents really wanted me to attend Catholic school from the beginning, but it was too much for them to afford. My dad heard about Inner-City Scholarship Fund at an open house that we attended and he applied right away. We received a letter a little while later saying they had matched me with a sponsor, Mrs. Kramer, who was going to help with the tuition. I know my family and I definitely appreciate all that she and Inner-City Scholarship Fund have done. My folks work hard, but without my sponsor Catholic school would not be possible.

How do you like your school?


It's a really good school with lots of clubs, good academic honors programs and AP classes. The fact is, going to college is just the standard now. When you get here, from the first day they're prepping you for college. There's an expectation here that you're going to get that degree.

What are your plans for the future?

I want to pursue business and computer science. I think that I have the tools, the mindset and all the skills to be successful. I definitely owe the development of those skills to my education.

Julie &

Julie Santos, Mother of Jaimy-Lynn Vargas, 1st Grade Incarnation School, Washington Heights

You're a passionate believer in Catholic schools, Julie. Can you tell us why?

Back in my time, this neighborhood was rough, but now it's worse. Today, I feel even more insecure about public schools than when I was growing up. Now there are too many kids in the classroom, drugs are too easy to find and passed along to other kids. Catholic schools are a different story. At Incarnation School, my daughter receives a great education in a safe place and that is very important to me.

When did Inner-City Scholarship Fund enter the picture?

I'm a single mother with four kids. I have a full time job but—as difficult as it was for me—I needed to ask for help. The school secretary told me about Inner-City Scholarship Fund. I received a scholarship for my older daughter Amy when she was at Incarnation School and it meant a lot. Now my youngest, Jaimy-Lynn, also receives a scholarship.

It sounds like things are working out for you now...

I have all my kids on the right path now. I constantly talk to them about doing well in school and getting good jobs. I want them to learn that so they have some sense of which way to go in life.

Dr. Anthony Miserandino, President Mount Saint Michael Academy, the Bronx

You've worked in both Catholic and public schools. Can you talk about your experiences at Mount Saint Michael?


I have 20 years experience in public education and 20 years in Catholic schools. It's a given that Catholic schools in the inner-city are safe and good schools. I think what makes Mount Saint Michael Academy and other Catholic schools great is that the kids know that they're cared for here. Kids have to work very hard to fall through the cracks. That just doesn't happen here.


What does Inner-City Scholarship Fund mean to your school and the city?

The economics of life here in the Bronx is a very delicate balance: 76% of our kids qualify for free or reduced lunch. This is astronomical. Without Inner-City Scholarship Fund, many inner-city Catholic schools wouldn't exist.

How are you able to measure success?

In the Bronx, 56% of kids graduate high school and only 30% of those kids go on to college. At our school, 100% percent graduate, 100% go to college and 62% consistently go to college on some sort of academic scholarship. You're not going anywhere in this society without a diploma. Education is the key to having the freedom to dream of possibilities in our society. We get the same kind of kid who would go to the public school down the block. We work with him, we enhance his skill set, his aspirations and we talk about right and wrong. They behave guite differently when they graduate. They aren't going to hang out on the street corner in the neighborhood with people who are going nowhere fast.





Ricky &

Ricky Recchia, 27, Emmy-Award winning TV sports writer/producer Inner-City Scholarship Fund Alumnus

How did you get involved with Inner-City Scholarship Fund?

After difficult experiences in public school early on, my mom moved me to Catholic school in the second grade. It's tough to remember exactly what year I got an Inner-City Scholarship Fund sponsor because I was so young, but it was definitely early on because I remember writing thank you letters to her in the 4th or 5th grade.

Do you remember who it was?

Absolutely, I had the same sponsor, Margaret Sharkey, throughout grade school and high school. I actually reached out and wrote to her in late 2013. I wanted to thank her and let her know that I am eternally grateful that she decided to help me so long ago, without knowing me at all.

What kind of difference did her sponsorship make?

It made all the difference. I grew up in the projects in Manhattan. Unless you've lived in poverty you really don't understand how debilitating it is. I'm not talking about wants, I'm talking about needs that people can't meet.

From little things like heat and hot water to bigger things like an education, you just start at a disadvantage. It's a feeling of hopelessness more than anything else because of the crime and the lack of people trying to do positive things with their lives. But I was really lucky because I got to go to Catholic schools and I knew if I did well it would give me an opportunity to remove myself from my situation and make a better life. I think my ability to think that way was a result of the experiences I had in Catholic school.

You've already accomplished so much, what does the future hold?

If I could go from where I started and get here already, anything is possible. I'll keep an open mind. As time goes on I hope to have opportunities to help people. I feel like I have an obligation to do so.

How did PwC decide to get involved with Inner-City Scholarship Fund?

What has your experience with Inner-City Scholarship Fund's work been like?

Robert: There's nothing better than helping children in need. These are students from difficult backgrounds. The opportunity they have to go to Catholic school and learn in a safe, disciplined environment exponentially increases their chances of going to college. We are thrilled to be a part of that. Inner-City Scholarship Fund has a real impact on New York and that's why we're involved.

Brendan: When it comes to a child's education I'm a big believer in finding the right environment for a student. Students who come from challenging economic areas who don't have a chance at a decent education are not going to get out of that cycle of poverty. When you get kids in the right environment with the right discipline and a little bit of stability that doesn't always exist in their daily lives, it can only have a positive effect. It's the first step to solving the problem of poverty.

Mitch: I think Rob said it well when he used the word "impact." What PwC is doing at the archdiocesan schools is a high-impact exercise because our volunteers are able to literally see the real time results in the classroom. By the same token, when I called Susan George, Inner-City Scholarship Fund's Executive Director, to tell her PwC was going to make an additional grant, she immediately reeled off the names of all the kids who were going to be able to go to school because of it. When you can correlate a dollar with a child's ability to get an education, it's unbelievable.

Ways to Participate

Whether it's providing scholarship assistance to an individual child or helping a school, Inner-City Scholarship Fund offers donors and volunteers different ways to be a friend to inner-city students or to champion an inner-city Catholic school.

Be A Student's Friend!

- Sponsor a high school student for \$3,700 per year or an elementary school student for \$2,200 per year. Sponsors receive periodic progress reports from students and can choose to know the student personally, if they wish.
- Fund a scholarship that gives public school parents the choice to enroll their child in a Catholic elementary and high school
- Provide emergency tuition assistance to parents who need help due to unforeseen family events
- Support Inner-City's Job Opportunities Program, which gives high school juniors opportunities to gain business experience through job-readiness workshops and paid internships. Volunteers coach students in resumé writing, interview skills, and business etiquette. Corporate sponsors give student participants their first paid internship over the summer break.
- Volunteer in the Junior Committee of Inner-City Scholarship Fund. Comprised of young professionals and headed up by a leadership committee, the Junior Committee provides hands-on support to inner-city students through tutoring, athletics, cultural field trips and community service activities.

Inner-City Scholarship Fund also gives individuals the opportunity to offer their financial support, expertise, and personal connections to improve a Catholic elementary school's enrollment, curriculum, facilities, professional development, and enrichment programs.

Additionally, volunteers in our Project YESS Leadership Committee raise and administer grant awards to inner-city elementary schools in need of capital improvements and repairs. Committee members provide program oversight, review applications, and oversee one special event each spring.

"I only sponsor one child," said an Inner-City Scholarship Fund donor when we were introduced recently. 


