Omar Garcia, a 2009 graduate of Monsignor Scanlan High School, is quick to relate the tremendous way his sponsorship by Ms. Sarah Lutz and Mr. John S. Van Rens affected his life. As you will see from his own remarks in this newsletter, Omar is already "giving back" and has plans to do more so as he heads to the College of New Rochelle. We wish all of our graduates the best as they move forward into adulthood.

the highest regard everywhere because "nobody does it better." He stressed that the need and demand for a values-centered education remains critical in New York City.

Attendees at last year's Gala were so enthralled by the Mount Carmel-Holy Rosary School Ballroom Dancers that

the boys and girls were asked to return for an encore this year that was equally well received. This fine troupe of skilled children honed their wonderful talent – and dance steps – at their own ICSF-supported elementary school in East Harlem.

uplifting place to learn. Adding to the program with a special acknowledgment speech was Edward Cardinal Egan graciously admitting to having coined the term "Project YESS does windows" further stating that he believed only a special person would understand just how windows could positively impact a whole community. Project YESS Founders Tom Quick, Tom Madden, Mark Rossi, Carla Romita and Lee Spelman-Dody then joined Cardinal Egan at the podium as they were honored for making a

difference in the lives of thousands of students over the past ten years.

The event raised nearly \$80,000 to support projects at 15 schools this year. The Project YESS Leadership Committee has been raising money to disburse grants to inner-city elementary schools in need of capital improvements and repairs since 1998. These repairs range from installing improved lighting, to fixing broken windows and upgrading security systems, all of which help support the viability

of every school. We sincerely thank the Project YESS Leadership Committee for all it does for the inner-city children and schools of the Archdiocese of New York.

ICSF School on Center Stage: Saint Joseph School on Bathgate Avenue in the Bronx

Saint Joseph School has served the Tremont community of the Bronx since 1877. Under the leadership of Ms. Janine Hughes for the last 10 years, the school has blossomed in ways that never seemed possible. Enrollment has more than doubled: Saint Joseph now serves over 460 students in Pre-Kindergarten through Grade 8! One hundred fifty-five of these students are supported by the Cardinal's Scholarship Program and fifteen by *Be A Student's Friend*.

Saint Joseph School fills a critical niche, being the only Bronx parochial elementary school out of a total of 63 that accepts students *regardless of their academic ability or emotional stability*. With its extended day lasting from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM, it offers extra time for both academics and curriculum enhancements, especially its musical band program.

For the last 15 years, all students in Grades 5 through 8 have come together to form an enthusiastic performance group. The Saint Joseph School band faculty teaches students how to play musical instruments including the trumpet, drums, saxophone and even the piccolo. Through their love of music, the students learn to work together in a disciplined and team-oriented manner. The poise that the 160 band members have acquired is on display each May at Saint Joseph's Annual Celebration of Music. This year, the school's 7th Annual Celebration took place on May 20th at Saint Jean Baptiste High School on the upper east side of Manhattan. Both old friends of Saint Joseph School and new supporters attended the event. Guests who could not find seats stood along the auditorium aisles enjoying the sounds of *Mission Impossible*, *African Blues* and *Oh Happy Day!*

In addition to continuing its wonderful music program, Saint Joseph School's leadership has been working tirelessly to expand its academic resources. For the third year, the school has employed a Cardinal Cooke Catholic Center literacy coach to work with teachers three days a week on preparing lessons and improving instruction techniques. The program has brought a genuine love of reading and writing to the entire student body. Saint Joseph's first *Poem in Your Pocket Day* was a big success. Students compiled anthologies of their work and shared their favorite poems with visiting firefighters, police officers and other community members. After a visit from author Steven Kroll, the students were inspired to take on a new endeavor: writing picture books for children at a school in Uganda, sharing their love of reading, writing, and learning with children who do not have access to many books.

Patent Expert and BASF Sponsor Speaks to Students about State of the Art Inventions

Mr. Thomas Meloro, a longtime Inner-City Scholarship Fund supporter and *Be A Student's Friend* sponsor, recently participated in Career Day at Saint Charles Borromeo School in West Harlem. Tom has been sponsoring a student there since 2003. During a prior visit with his sponsored student, Principal Sister Marianne Poole mentioned her plans to organize a Career Day, and Tom enthusiastically offered to speak about his professional specialty, which is patent law.

Last June, Tom visited several classrooms from Grades 5 to 8. He began by telling students that he graduated in engineering from Manhattan College. Afterward,

he interviewed for a position at a popular coffee plant, Maxwell House, in Hoboken, New Jersey. Tom told students that after much deliberation, he decided to decline the job. Tom felt that law would make an interesting career and allow him to help many people. He then attended Georgetown Law School and developed an expertise in patent law.

Tom told students that he has also worked on patents for various medical inventions including a "stent," a tiny mesh object inserted into the heart to prevent blockages. He talked with the students about how rewarding it is to work on medical inventions since they

can help a large number of people live healthier, longer lives. When asked about the strangest invention he had ever worked on, Tom replied that it was a machine for creasing pants!

Inner-City Scholarship Fund heartily thanks Mr. Thomas Meloro for exposing students to a new and interesting profession. Perhaps one of these students will pursue patent law in the future!

school children at Saint Elizabeth, another ICSF-supported school in the Washington Heights neighborhood of Manhattan. To add to her credentials, she volunteered for the International Rescue Committee, which prepares refugees to attain the English skills necessary in the United States.

Ladylaura will be attending Barnard College – the first in her family to go to college – and aspires to become a prosecutor. She is very grateful to her *Be A Student's Friend* sponsors Mr. Christopher Brent and his late wife Liane Brent, who made her formative experience at Mount Saint Ursula possible.

2009 Be A Student's Friend, Monsignor Scanlan High School Graduate Omar Garcia

The Church of Saint Helena played host to Monsignor Scanlan High School's June 12th Commencement, a celebration shared by family, friends, teachers and several sponsors of *Be A Student's Friend*. Mr. John A. Van Rens and his sponsored student Omar Garcia were together for the occasion.

The son of Mexican residents of the U.S. who arrived in 1984, Omar and his family lived on a boat on City Island in the Bronx until Omar was 12 while his father worked at a boatyard. Once his parents had saved enough money from

both of their jobs, they moved with Omar and his sister into a house.

Omar progressed through Monsignor Scanlan's Satellite, Regents, and Honors programs. He is also known for his generosity of spirit, having completed 300 hours of community service during high school as active participant in the school's "Midnight Run" program that provides clothes, food and other basics to the homeless in New York City. While working towards Eagle Scout, Omar became interested in first aid and learned a little about himself and all of us: "In

order to change a community, a person has to change themselves."

Omar will attend the College of New Rochelle and plans to pursue its nursing program through which he believes he can make the most positive difference. Omar is grateful to Mr. Van Rens and the way his sponsorship affected him. "*Be A Student's Friend* gave me the motivation to do better in school and in life and to realize people are there to help no matter how big or small."

Happenings at Our Schools

Elementary Schools

- **Our Lady of Mount Carmel-Saint Benedicta's** student council has accepted a challenge from its Staten Island district city council representative's office named the Civic Kids Initiative. Students are asked to develop a year-by-year plan that will improve the community's environment. This year the students chose to continue their work to beautify the neighborhood of its school and local businesses. This year's murals include a painting of Sicily's Mount Etna erupting dramatically and murals for a local karate school. They also added to last year's murals in their own schoolyard and to one at a local luncheonette. Out of 12 schools that participated, Our Lady of Mount Carmel-Saint Benedicta was recognized as having the best project, winning \$3,000 for the school in local discretionary spending from Councilman Andrew McMahon's office.
- At **Saint Mark the Evangelist School**, students have been writing picture books for children living in an orphanage in Uganda. The students have written and illustrated beautiful picture books that will be sent to the Corburwas orphanage.
- The Step Team from **Immaculate Conception School** on 151st Street in Manhattan was named Grand Champion at a national competition in Hershey Park, Pennsylvania. The Step Team received the highest overall score placing first in five out of seven categories including Outstanding Precision, Outstanding Spirit and Best in Step.
- **Saint Helena School** has had solar-roof panels installed that can generate 100,000 kilowatt/hours of electricity. The devices will save the school about 25 percent on its ConEd power bill as well as protect the environment.
- For the second year, selected students from **Our Lady of Lourdes School's** choir performed at the National Constitution Center in Philadelphia on June 6th. Students spent the morning exploring the museum's collection and sang in the lobby for visitors. Traveling expenses and admission costs to the center were defrayed by National Constitution Center funding. After the event, the children were given a walking tour of historic Philadelphia.
- The Drama Club at **Saint Jude School** produced a junior version of the Broadway musical *Annie*. The students took the show on the road and

performed at Nora Cronin Presentation Academy in Newburgh, NY and to senior citizens at the United Hebrew Home.

High Schools

- **Saint Raymond High School for Boys** in the Bronx has continued its library technology expansion plan providing much-improved resources.
- **Saint Barnabas High School** in the Bronx hosted its first annual film festival. Students who enrolled in Film Anthology, a new course last September, wrote, produced, directed and starred in two films. The first, *Chalking: Addiction or Fiction*, directed by senior Amanda Villano and *The Study Guides*, directed by Stephanie Mullen.
- **Mother Cabrini High School** The school's Mission Volunteer Program allowed students to take trips to Syracuse, NY, where they helped local organizations provide services to those in need, and to New Orleans, where they helped in various post-hurricane rebuilding efforts. Cabrini students also raised \$640 for Autism Speaks, the awareness organization of that name based in New York.
