On Tuesday, May 21, Inner-City hosted the 43rd Annual FRIENDS Gala, raising nearly \$1.2 million dollars to provide scholarship support and enrichment programing for students at inner-city Catholic schools in the Archdiocese of New York. The event, which had over four hundred guests, was hosted at Cipriani 42nd Street, and its theme was "Sky's the Limit," recognizing the infinite possibilities that Catholic schools make possible for their students.

Guests enjoyed performances from students at Mount St. Michael Academy, Notre Dame School of Manhattan, and St. Raymond Elementary School, who sang classic songs reflecting the "Sky's the Limit" theme, including "Fly Me to the Moon" and "Wind Beneath My Wings." Amaya Rojas, a seventh grader at Santa Maria School in the Bronx, delivered this year's student speech. She discussed her time at Santa Maria. which she has attended since

kindergarten, and the opportunities that she received because of her Be A Student's Friend scholarship.

"I know that this scholarship is a privilege, and that's why I try each day to be the best student that I can be, work hard, keep my grades high, study, and review things we did in class, to make my family, myself, and my sponsors proud. I've earned honors every quarter and have made the most of my experience at Santa Maria School," said Amaya, before saying that her dream for the future was to help people as a doctor or a teacher. CATHOLIC SCHOOL GRADUATE OVERCOMING ENORMOUS ODDS

Inner-City Scholarship Fund is proud of all its graduates, as most have overcome steep odds to achieve their academic goals. The story of one such graduate, Robert Chapman, is characteristic of how Inner-City students respond to both personal adversity and the generosity of others.

When Robert was in 5th grade, doctors found a tumor in his brain that had been present since birth and had grown undetected until it reached the size of a golf ball. Robert underwent surgery to remove the tumor, and he spent months re-learning how to walk and talk. Sacred Heart, his Catholic elementary school, sent a teacher to work with him during his recovery. Robert worked constantly to keep up with his studies, and he was able to graduate from Sacred Heart and continue his Catholic education at All Hallows High School in the Bronx.

Since entering high school, his

path was anything but easy. In 2014, Chapman was faced with another tumor, this one pressing against his optic nerve and causing him temporary blindness. A year later, doctors found a third tumor. Thankfully, both were removed and Chapman is now considered tumor-free.

Throughout his struggles Robert kept a positive attitude and worked hard to maintain good grades in hopes of completing high school on time. "I was motivated to just keep going, no matter what," Chapman said. "Don't let the tumor get in the way of what's happening."

This past June, Robert graduated on time and has been accepted into Mercy College. He hopes to attend medical school after that. Robert credits Christine and Stephen Schwarzman, his Inner-City Scholarship Fund sponsors, for not only providing tuition assistance to his family, but for inspiring him with their kindness when times were very tough.

CATHOLIC SCHOOLS RECEIVE SPECIAL ACCREDITATION

Faith-Based. Future-Focused.

This past March, Catholic schools in the Archdiocese of New York hosted an AdvancED External Review Team that reviewed the system and a cross section of its schools to evaluate the system's adherence to the AdvancED Accreditation Standards and to make a recommendation for AdvancED School System Accreditation.

The team found that Catholic schools met the requirements for accreditation and announced that

it will be recommending the system for AdvancED School System
Accreditation. To earn AdvancED
School System Accreditation,
systems must: 1) meet the AdvancED
Accreditation Standards; 2) implement a continuous process of improvement; and 3) host an External Review team once every five years.

As a part of the accreditation process, a team of trained professionals from across the state and nation, reviewed Archdiocese of New York documents and performance data; interviewed system, school and community stakeholders; conducted site reviews to several schools; and observed system and school practices in action. The team offered both recognition of strong practices as well as areas for improvement to the system.

Jameela is a sophomore at St. Jean Baptiste High School on East 75th Street, a beautiful tree-lined street off Park Avenue in one of Manhattan's coveted upper-east side zip codes.

Only a forty-minute subway ride, a five-mile distance from her apartment on 165th Street in the Bronx, Jameela's two neighborhoods could not be more

polarized. At home, she immerses herself in family and mom's home-cooked meals. At school, this sophomore with a 90 grade point average continues to push herself, especially in math (her favorite subject), and makes time for the high school softball team, which she joined last year. Which world does she love more?

Jameela loves them equally. The daughter of parents who came to New York from the Dominican Republic, Jameela knows the nature of hard work and struggling to make ends meet. Her father drives a taxi and her mother is a janitor. They rely on food stamps and with a monthly rent of almost \$900, there is very little left for her education. Jameela is the youngest of five children and her parents are committed to her success, to making sure that their daughter has the proper academic foundation so she can attend college and enter the world of business and banking, her chosen career path.

Jameela's role model is her cousin Yanilda, who was also dedicated to her studies and now attends college, with the goal of becoming a detective. Because of her parents' unrelenting commitment to her Catholic school education, Jameela's world is one of hope. But this teenager understands that the onus is on her, to work hard and push herself through walls and barriers in order to accomplish her academic and career goals. She understands that education paves the road to self-appreciation and fulfillment. One of her wishes is to help alleviate the financial burdens on her parents.

Jameela is a remarkably focused student, who has the proper balance of family and school, who recognizes that education is a highway on the map to a successful and fulfilling future. JOB OPPORTUNITIES PROGRAM GIVES STUDENTS A SUMMER TO REMEMBER

Inner-City Scholarship Fund's Job Opportunities Program gives high school juniors the unique opportunity to gain experience in a business setting through a series of job-readiness workshops, culminating in a paid summer internship at some of the most prestigious companies in New York City. The workshops cover essential skills like resume-writing, interviewing and office etiquette, and this year companies participating in the program include ABC, KPMG, Kelley Drye and Hogan Lovells, along with several companies joining the program for the first time.

The Job Opportunities Program enables inner-city students with the knowledge and skill-set that they will need when they enter the evolving workforce. Participating in the Job Opportunities Program continues to bear fruit long after the summer is over.

This year, a Job Opportunities Prgram alumna and member of the class of 2016, Linda Chan, secured a spot in Citi Bank's Summer Analyst Class. Before attaining the position, Linda asked to meet with someone from the program who had helped her when she was in high school. She said that in that meeting she was reminded "to stay calm and confident [because] there

is a reason for all this to happen." Thanks to the Job Opportunities Program, Linda had the skillset to gain a spot in the class, but also the knowledge to help her through the process."

The Job Opportunities Program is always on the lookout for volunteers to assist in its workshops and for companies interested in offering internships.

LEARNING TO LOOK TEACHES ART APPRECIATION

Now in its twenty-fourth year, the Learning to Look program enhances students' appreciation and knowledge of art and gives them a chance to develop their creative thinking. What makes this program different from any other art education program are the four main educational goals: the seeing and feeling of visual relationships (aesthetics), the making of art (production), the study of works of art (art history), and the critical evaluation of art (art criticism).

This curriculum is taught in eight Inner-City supported schools by a

group of dedicated volunteers, with different courses for each grade level. For example, the second grade focuses on 19th century European paintings and sculpture, the third grade learns about American art, and the fourth grade looks at old masters paintings and sculpture.

The students' experience is taken above and beyond by their annual trips to the Metropolitan Museum of Art in the spring. These trips allow the students to see the pieces in person and gain a new level of appreciation for these historic works of art. Students are able to enjoy

this opportunity every year thanks to the 29 volunteers, including several first-time members. These volunteers meet three times throughout the year to review and prepare the curriculum for their time in the classroom.
