41ST ANNUAL GALA RAISES OVER \$1 MILLION

On May 9, more than four hundred supporters of Inner-City Scholarship Fund gathered for the 41st Annual FRIENDS Gala at Cipriani 42nd Street in New York City. Led by the Gala Chairs, Inner-City trustee Michael Esposito and his wife Wendy, the event raised over \$1 million to support Inner-City's mission to provide tuition assistance and enrichment programs for Catholic school students across the Archdiocese of New York.

The evening featured Inner-City supported students Isabella Guzman Gallego, a fourth grader at St. Raymond's Elementary School who delivered the invocation, and Darwin Contreras, a senior at All Hallows High School in the Bronx, who was this year's student speaker.

Darwin spoke about the sacrifices his mother made to send him to Catholic school and the achievements made possible by that education. A First Honors student every semester of high school, he was chosen for leadership conferences in Chicago and Dublin, Ireland. He will attend the College of the Holy Cross on a full scholarship

and plans to study to become a diplomat. Darwin said, "Some people believe that being able to attend a Catholic institution is the best thing that can happen to you; I am living proof that this is true. And as we always say at All Hallows: Until we meet again, may God continue to hold you all in the palm of His hand."

The evening also featured the "Battle of the Boroughs," introduced by Master of Ceremonies Mo Rocca, who sang a special version of the American Standard "Manhattan" with clever references to Catholic schools in each of the three boroughs within the Archdiocese of New York.

The "Battle" featured students from the Bronx, Manhattan, and Staten Island wowing the guests with their musical talents. Kristen Kaiser of Moore Catholic High School performed George Gershwin's "I've Got Rhythm." The St. Raymond's Elementary School Choir performed "Can't Stop the Feeling!" by Justin Timberlake, and Justina Diaz of Blessed Sacrament performed "Home" from *The Wiz*.

Following the musical performances, guests participated in their own "Battle of the Boroughs" text-to-pledge drive, collectively raising an additional \$100,000 for Catholic schools in the borough they were assigned.

Before concluding the program,
Timothy Michael Cardinal Dolan
thanked the Espositos for their work
as Gala Chairs as well as everyone in
attendance for the success of the event.
He echoed Susan George's statement
that "Each borough and county in
the Archdiocese of New York has a
special place in the heart of the
Inner-City family."

significant growth in membership.
Young professionals volunteer their
time running enrichment activities,
primarily in Harlem Catholic
elementary schools, including field
trips, basketball, tutoring, and holiday
parties. The committee also hosts
social events for its members
throughout the year for fun,
networking, and fundraising
for Inner-City.

Dedicated volunteers participated in field trips to the American Museum of Natural History and the Central Park Zoo, tutoring sessions for test prep and the ever-popular basketball program. Without the Junior Committee's programs, enrichment opportunities such as these would not be available in many Inner-City supported schools.

On April 21, nearly three hundred attendees, including over one hundred first-timers, gathered on the Harbor Lights yacht for a night of dinner and dancing at the annual Spring Soiree fundraiser. Guests enjoyed networking,

JOB OPPORTUNITIES PROGRAM ENJOYS ANOTHER SUCCESSFUL SUMMER

Inner-City's Job Opportunities Program excels year after year at providing one of the most important experiences in the lives of one hundred Catholic high school juniors. Principals nominate the best and the brightest to take on a job readiness program in their second semester that provides training in resume writing, interview preparation, business etiquette, personal financial management, and much more. Professionals from all business fields give up several Saturdays to work personally with students to coach and guide them towards obtaining paid summer internships.

In 2017, students from thirteen Catholic high schools participated, and fiftytwo have been placed in internships at prestigious companies and non-profits around the city including Colgate Palmolive, Mount Sinai Hospital, and Linklaters LLP. The interns often continue relationships by networking with their employers throughout their senior year of high school, and an astounding number are asked to come back for another summer internship.

Inner-City's invaluable partnership with Bloomberg, LP continues to flourish in new ways. A new program is Bloomberg Startup, which includes an internship program for high school students throughout the city. The program also placed a Job Opportunities Program student at Bloomberg for the first time this year. Many students also enjoyed a series of Bloomberg Startup workshops designed for high school students

on subjects ranging from careers to robotics to showcasing women's impact on the world.

In the coming year, the Job Opportunities Program plans to increase the number of internship opportunities available to students and asks for your help in identifying businesses or non-profits who would consider hiring one or more students for an internship.

LEARNING TO LOOK

Inner-City Scholarship Fund's
Learning to Look program just
completed its twenty-second year
in the Archdiocese of New York's
elementary schools. Nine hundred
students in second through fifth
grades at nine different elementary
schools enjoyed in-depth art
appreciation lessons from a group of
thirty dedicated women who bring with
them great experience and knowledge
in the world of art, as a former art
teacher, a gallery owner, or a docent at
the Metropolitan Museum of Art.

The program is designed to build upon each previous lesson and give students a comprehensive introduction to art history, beginning with the Old Masters, continuing with 19th and 20th Century European Art, and finally ending with Impressionism. During these lessons, they see and learn about great works

from reproductions, and in one particular class the students recreate the paintings live by making their own costumes and posing.

Learning to Look is growing too.
This year, two new volunteer teachers, with help from two experienced teachers, added Incarnation School in Washington Heights to the program. Other schools include Immaculate Conception School in the Bronx, Our Lady Queen of Angels, Sacred Heart of Jesus, St. Brigid, St. Ann, Guardian Angel, and Blessed Sacrament schools, all of which are in Manhattan.

The six-class series, taught once a month by our incredible volunteer teachers, culminates in a trip to the Metropolitan Museum of Art where the students see, first-hand with

their teachers, the art that they learned about all year. The response from the budding young artists is incredibly positive. Inner-City is so grateful to the staff at the Metropolitan Museum of Art for being so supportive of this program and for allowing students the unique opportunity to see the museum before it opens. The staff at the museum could not be more helpful.

As with all FRIENDS programs, Inner-City always needs to find volunteers to teach Learning to Look, as it requires significant training and class observation before teaching a class of one's own.

CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS COMMITTEE'S ANNUAL COCKTAIL BENEFIT

More than three hundred guests joined His Eminence Timothy Cardinal Dolan on Tuesday, June 20, for the Capital Improvements Committee's Annual Cocktail Benefit. The event was held at Top of the Rock Observation Deck at Rockefeller Center. Nearly \$200,000 was raised through ticket sales, raffle prizes, and a silent auction that included a six-night African Safari, a three-night stay in Turks & Caicos, and several other featured packages.

Led by co-chairs Andrea Baker, Timothy Dempsey, and Thomas O'Halloran, the Capital Improvements Leadership Committee has granted more than \$209,000 in grant awards to fourteen elementary schools this year. Proceeds from the event will improve security systems, repair structural damage from fires, fix plumbing and leaks, and fund many other necessary repairs at Catholic schools throughout the Archdiocese of New York.

To date, the Capital Improvements Committee—a program of Inner-City Scholarship Fund's sister organization Champions for Quality Education—has provided over \$5.4 million to transform Catholic schools through over three hundred projects. They are happy to see the start of the new school year, as schools across the Archdiocese have opened with repaired, refreshed facilities thanks to their support.

AN EVERLASTING GIFT

Gonzalo was born to a Dominican family in the Bronx and attended St. Margaret Mary Grammar School thanks to the generous support of long time Inner-City sponsors Laura and James Naughton, who have stayed with Gonzalo since 2008. "I couldn't be more grateful to Mr. and Mrs. Naughton for the opportunity they gave me," said Gonzalo.

Gonzalo made the most of his time at All Hallows, where he was a member of the National Honor Society, participated in student government, and played varsity soccer. He was also captain of the school's nationally ranked math team, which won the national Algebra 2 contest last year and this year finished third out of fifty teams nationwide. In the individual competition, Gonzalo finished

CATHOLIC SCHOOLS NIGHT AT YANKEE STADIUM

On Friday, June 9, fifteen hundred Catholic school students flocked to Yankee Stadium to watch the Yankees play the Baltimore Orioles. For many of the students in attendance, the warm June night marked their first-ever trip to a major league baseball game.

The ceremonial first pitch was thrown by Sister Patrice Owens, a longtime Yankees fan and the principal of Immaculate Conception School in the Bronx. The students in attendance, especially from Immaculate Conception, were thrilled to see her take the mound.

Forty lucky students also had the chance to participate in Parade Day before the game, running around the warning track and the field with other students. To cap it all off, the Yankees won by a margin of 6-2.

Proceeds from select ticket sales raised \$50,000 to be disbursed among the nine Catholic school regions of the Archdiocese of New York. Funds will be directed toward scholarship support, technology implementation, special education, and other special programs.

In 2012, the Archdiocese of New York's Department of Education began the process of Regionalization: a transition from a parish-based school system to a regional model divided among nine geographic areas. Each of the nine regions is a separate, not-for-profit, educational corporation chartered by the New York State Department of Education. Every parish is responsible for, contributes to, and has a voice in Archdiocesan education, working to ensure an academically excellent, fully-enrolled Catholic school system for years to come.

SUSAN GEORGE RECEIVES THE NCEA PRESIDENT'S AWARD

On April 17, 2017, Inner-City Scholarship Fund Executive Director Susan George traveled to St. Louis to attend the National Catholic Education Association President's Award Dinner, where she received the Msgr. John F. Meyers Award. This award is presented annually to an individual who has provided substantial support for Catholic education through contributions in the areas of development, public relations, scholarship programs, financial management, or government relations. Susan was selected for this award from a crowded field of figures in Catholic education across the country due to her many years of hard work with Inner-City.

Under her leadership, the organization now provides tuition assistance and scholarships to over seven thousand students annually. She has also led the organization through a \$125 million *Kids Are Our Capital* endowment campaign, just \$2 million shy of completion at the time of this publication, that ensures funding for thousands more inner-city kids for generations to come. In her acceptance remarks, Susan thanked




