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INNER-CITY CELEBRATES THE CLASS OF 2020

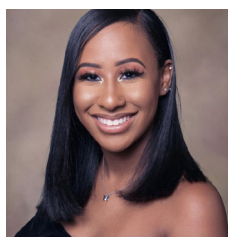
This June marked the end of a unique school year, abruptly changed midway through for students across the country. Especially hard hit were seniors, who found many of the milestones that they had spent years working toward suddenly taken away, and were forced to make one of the most important decisions of their young lives in a time of great uncertainty.

In light of all this, Inner-City Scholarship Fund commends the class of 2020 all the more. They have spent their lives overcoming obstacles, and their perseverance in the face of unprecedented changes is a testament to their resilience and to the Catholic schools where they have learned so much.

73% of the students at Inner-City supported Catholic schools live near or below the poverty line, and 53% are raised by a single parent, but 99% graduate and 98% are accepted to college.

This fall, Catholic high school graduates will attend some of the most prestigious colleges and universities across the nation, including Howard University, Syracuse University, the University of Notre Dame, and Yale University. Inner-City congratulates all the members of the class of 2020, and wishes them the best in college and beyond.

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Dear Friends,

It is with great pride that I offer congratulations to the class of 2020 on their successful completion of high school. As we all know, the world has been turned upside down by the COVID-19 crisis. I am extremely proud of our seniors for their hard work and dedication to finishing the school year strong. Their success is evident as nearly all plan to attend higher education at institutions across the country. Now more than ever, your generosity is positively impacting the lives of so many students. Countless families we serve are suffering because of layoffs, salary furloughs, illnesses and deaths related to the COVID-19 crisis and are in need of additional tuition assistance.

INNER-CITY HOSTS FIRST-EVER VIRTUAL FRIENDS GALA



This year, Inner-City hosted a very special edition of the FRIENDS Gala, its annual spring dinner dance. The 44th Annual FRIENDS Gala on Tuesday, May 12, was the first-ever virtual Gala, streamed live to the homes of Inner-City supporters, where they could watch from the comfort of their couches.

The event was a success, raising over \$750,000 to support Catholic school students in a time of great difficulty. Inner-City trustee Mo Rocca returned to serve as emcee, in his finest black tie and slippers.

He delivered the opening remarks and presented a video package of student performances from past Galas, followed by an appearance from Susan George and Peter Grauer, Executive Director and President of Inner-City Scholarship Fund, respectively.

They spoke about the great efforts Catholic schools put into the change to at-home learning and thanked Inner-City's supporters for their generosity.

After their remarks, Mo conducted an interview with Fareed Ishaq, a current *Be A Student's Friend* scholarship recipient and a student at St. Raymond Elementary School in the Bronx.

Mo and Fareed discussed life at his Catholic school, his experience after moving to at-home learning, and their shared love of the game show *Jeopardy!* Fareed said that while he missed his friends and teachers, he believed St. Raymond's was the best school in the world.

At the end of the interview, Fareed thanked his family and his sponsors, the Morrison family, for helping him attend Catholic school.

The event closed with an appearance from His Eminence, Timothy Cardinal Dolan, who spoke to Mo Rocca about life during quarantine and the importance of Catholic schools before delivering a closing prayer, and a special performance of "Over the Rainbow" by students from Maria Regina High School.

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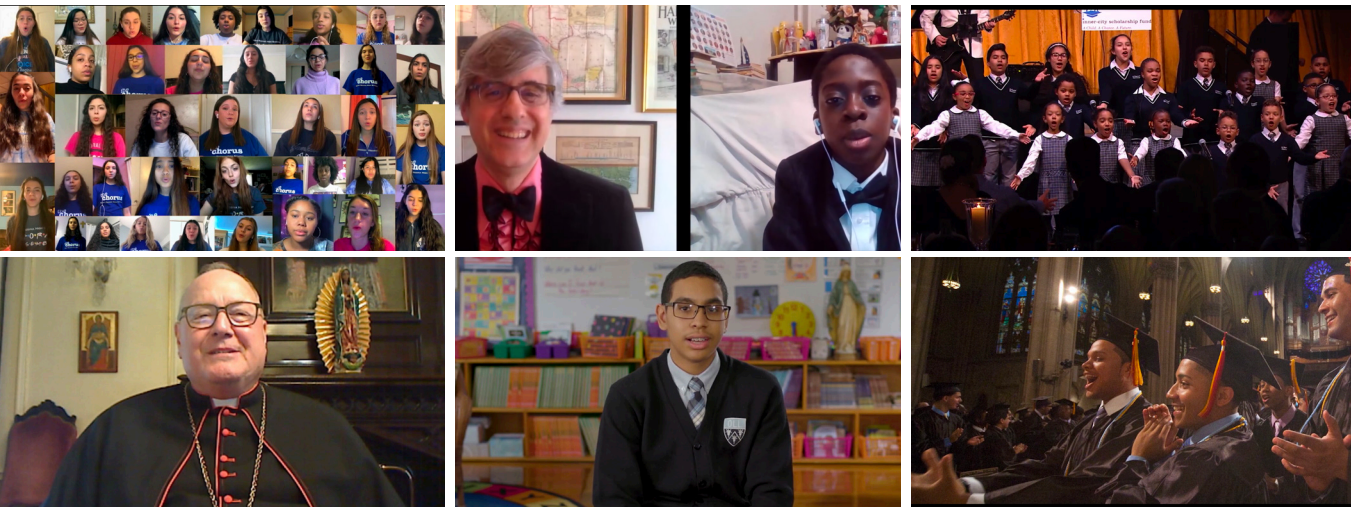

CATHOLIC SCHOOLS ADJUST QUICKLY TO REMOTE LEARNING



Starting in mid-March, Catholic schools in the Archdiocese of New York made a complete changeover from standard classroom instruction to at-home learning.

The COVID-19 crisis that has upended so much around the world also forced the closure of all school buildings in New York.

Thankfully, the hard work of teachers, principals, and families allowed students to continue learning with minimal interruption.

Students from kindergarten to twelfth grade participated in daily Zoom classes and worked on assignments and homework problems from their own homes. Schools shared footage of this at-home learning on their social media pages, showing young

children practicing the basics of reading and writing, older students and high schools hard at work on math, science, and history, and students of all ages learning essential enrichment subjects like art and music.

This incredible adjustment would not be possible without the hard work of so many Catholic school teachers, who put in long hours of work to adjust their lessons to fit with the new environment.

Parents, many of whom are now working from home as well, have also provided necessary support and made great sacrifices to ensure that their children are able to learn effectively from home. Catholic schools look forward to opening their school buildings safely this September to begin the 2020-21 school year.

STUDENT SPOTLIGHT

Inner-City Scholarship Fund recently had the chance to speak to a Catholic school student about the impact the switch to at-home learning had on him during the end of last school year. Agustin Gonzalez, a recently graduated eighth grader at Immaculate Conception School in the Bronx, said that he and his sixth-grade brother made the switch from regular school to remote classes in March, after the coronavirus forced all schools in New York to close for the remainder of the school year.

His teachers held Zoom classes throughout the week, with Tuesdays and Thursdays reserved for working on special assignments. Enrichment classes like art and music had weekly assignments, and physical education teachers posted workouts and other fitness advice for students. During their classes, teachers would go over the previous day's work and work with them on the next lesson, before starting their assignments for the next class.

"The teachers all have their own styles," he said when asked if he had a favorite, but he appreciated them all and enjoyed learning from them. Asked about his favorite subject, he said "Math, because I have the ability to use different methods to solve the same equation." He went on to say he enjoyed reading and writing, "because I can learn new ways to express myself."

His mother Delmira, who works as a bookkeeper, was grateful for all the help the school had given them as they made the change. The family needed a laptop in order to learn from home, which she said the school provided and that the principal and teachers were always responsive to their questions.

"It's been difficult," she said about the transition. "But I'm so glad Immaculate Conception was able to help us. Both of my sons have been there since kindergarten."

She said that the scholarship Agustin received through the *Be A Student's Friend* program was essential. Both Agustin and Mrs. Gonzalez thanked his sponsors, Mr. and Mrs. Najjar, and both pointed to the values and religious education provided by Immaculate Conception as key in his development both morally and intellectually. Agustin served as valedictorian at his class's virtual graduation, and he will be attending Regis High School in the fall. Inner-City is proud to have helped him receive such a great education, through the help of his sponsors and the hard work of all his teachers.

Below is a message recently published by Superintendent of Schools, Michael J. Deegan, announcing the Catholic Schools re-opening plan for the 2020-21 school year.

Since April, the Catholic Schools Re-Opening Council has worked tirelessly to prepare guidance that will ensure the safe return of our students, teachers, and staff to our school buildings. I am grateful for their efforts. Today, I am pleased to share with you the result of their work Catholic Schools Opening: Moving Forward Together.

Principals are currently developing localized school plans based on the needs of their communities and physical spaces. Those plans and this manual are representative of the most recent guidance from government, state, and local health officials, which is changing continually. As guidance changes, plans will be updated.

While our buildings have been closed our schools were open; teaching and learning has been taking place. It is now time to return to our "homes" and move forward together, reinvigorating our Catholic school buildings with the return of our students.

We are committed to opening schools for 5 days a week for in school instruction for all students, ensuring social distancing can safely be maintained in our buildings under the direct supervision of a teacher.

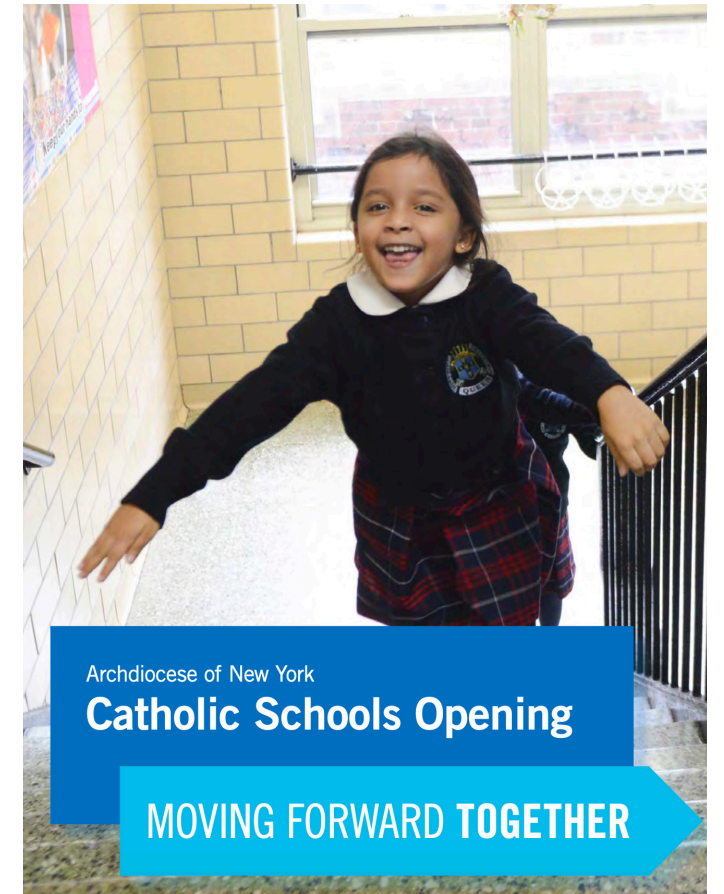
We have encouraged principals to be creative with space, while ensuring that the health and safety of our staff and students are primary in their decision-making. For some buildings or class sizes that cannot accommodate all students socially distanced for a full 5 days, plans will be created by the principal using an alternating day/week cycle.

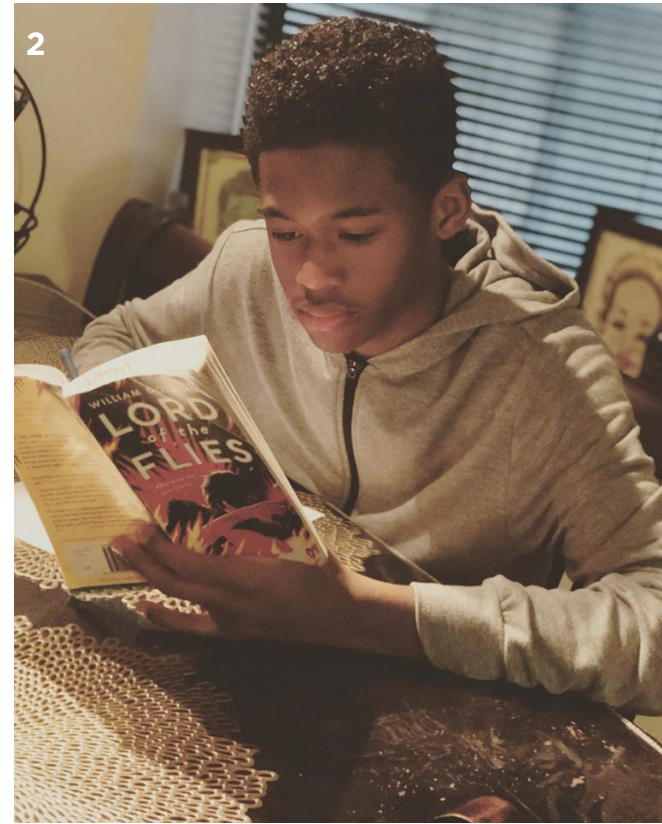
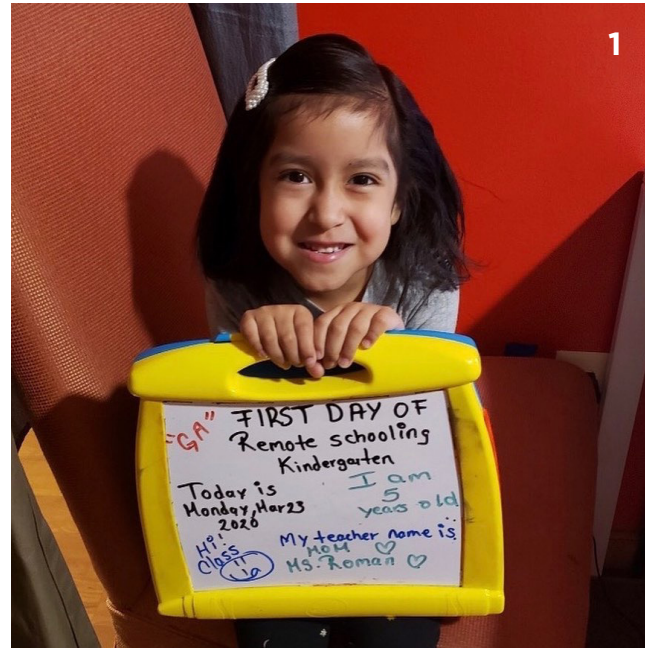

A VIRTUAL BREAKFAST CONVERSATION WITH SCOTT WALKER

JUNIOR COMMITTEE ANNOUNCES NEW LEADERSHIP INITIATIVES

The Junior Committee of Inner-City Scholarship Fund, made up of young professional volunteers who lead enrichment activities for Inner-City students, was planning for the Spring Soiree, their biggest fundraiser of the year, when the COVID-19 pandemic struck. Not only was their biggest fundraiser canceled, but student enrichment programs were suddenly cut short.

The first six months of the fiscal year had been a great success, including four field trips, three holiday parties, and a season and a half of basketball. In the face of these challenges, Junior Committee leadership began to meet regularly to plan the future of the volunteer organization.

They focused on some reorganizing of the Committee including rolling out new roles for leadership. They knew that marketing was key to grow the number of Junior leaders and volunteers and so created a separate Marketing and Social

Committee, along with a new fundraising plan to cover all expenses while expanding the number of students supported.

More details will follow as the Juniors begin a new year. The year will be a pilot year of trying out the new ideas. In the meantime, the Junior Committee will continue to plan for student activities in the fall.

All involved hope to work with students in person, but in accordance with the risks and level of uncertainty, the Committee will be working to provide some enrichment experiences to students virtually.

Her husband Steve Dutton serves on the Capital Improvement Committee, a program of Champions for Quality Education, and together they have sponsored several students over the years.
