"This year we're giving over \$14 million in scholarships to deserving students all across the city and that wouldn't be possible without Inner-City's impressive team and dedicated donors who support our students to reach new heights," said Peter T. Grauer, Chairman at Bloomberg and President of Inner-City Scholarship Fund, during his opening remarks.

His Eminence, Timothy Michael Cardinal Dolan, Archbishop of New York, presented the 2022 Inner-City Scholarship Fund Award to John R. Greed, Chairman, President, and CEO of Mutual of America. During his acceptance remarks, Mr. Greed discussed his affinity for Inner-City's mission, sharing that he benefited from a similar assistance program when he attended Catholic school. He expressed the profound positive impact his education had on him and how it shaped him into who he is, saying "I did not want a handout, but I needed a hand-up. That is exactly what the Inner-City Scholarship Fund is all about and does each year for its 8,500 students."

Catholic school student Joskarl Nunez, a junior from All Hallows High School in the Bronx, gave a moving speech about how blessed he feels to be a part of the Catholic school community. At the height of the pandemic, he felt supported by his teachers, both during remote and in-person learning. Because of Inner-City Scholarship Fund, he feels that he has

benefited from great teachers who have given him the tools he needs to follow his dreams. He aspires to attend Fordham University and is interested in pursuing a career in biological sciences.

The evening included festive holiday performances from St. Raymond Elementary School choir and the Notre Dame School of Manhattan choir.

### 33rd Annual St. Thomas More Award Luncheon

On October 19, His Eminence, Timothy Michael Cardinal Dolan, Archbishop of New York, honored Lucy A. Brusco, Head of Treasury Legal at Morgan Stanley, at the 33rd Annual Saint Thomas More Award Luncheon at Cipriani 42nd Street in Manhattan.

Hosted by the Lawyers Committee of Inner-City Scholarship Fund, the annual luncheon welcomed over 300 guests, raising more than \$350,000 in support of Inner-City's mission to provide scholarship support for underserved Catholic school students in the Archdiocese of New York.

Thomas J. Meloro, Partner at Willkie Farr & Gallagher, was presented with the John P. Cooney Award for Mentorship and Community Involvement. Mr. Meloro has been a dedicated Inner-City Scholarship Fund donor for 24 years.

# Catholic Schools in the Archdiocese of New York Report Continued Excellence in Test Scores

It is with great pride that we share with you our schools' outstanding results on the 2022 New York State tests.

Once again, the Catholic values-based curriculum taught in the Archdiocese of New York has produced results that lead most schools in the state of New York.

Scores reported for schools in the Archdiocese of New York in 2022 from the New York State Education Department (NYSED) for grades 3-8 reflect nearly 52% of students passed math and 64% of students passed reading. When compared to NYC government schools, where 37.9% passed math and 49% of all students passed reading, you can see why we are so proud of our Catholic school students. Looking nationally, while different from the state assessments, Catholic school students in the Archdiocese of New York consistently outpace peers across the country on the NWEA MAP® tests.


Catholic Schools in the Archdiocese of New York have maintained a level of excellence with the support and leadership of His Eminence, Timothy Cardinal Dolan and Mr. Michael J. Deegan, Superintendent of Schools in the Archdiocese of New York. The archdiocese invested heavily in curriculum, professional development, technology, and social-emotional support for students and staff alike. These efforts mitigated and often eliminated the degree of learning loss experienced during the pandemic in school systems around the country.



"Our English Language Arts scores jumped by 7.3 percent, while our math scores held steady with a slight decline from pre-pandemic levels," said Deegan. This is a testament to the dedication of our pastors, principals, and teachers in delivering a Christ-centered, academically excellent education. These results demonstrate that our work will continue to achieve positive outcomes and elevated expectations for all our students."

### **Superintendent of Schools Update**

In December, His Eminence, Timothy Michael Cardinal Dolan announced the retirement of beloved educator Michael J. Deegan as superintendent of schools effective August 31, 2023.

"I am so very grateful to Cardinal Dolan for entrusting me with the care and stewardship of this great Catholic school system which gave me so much as a student, as a young man and ultimately as a Catholic educator for half a century," shared Deegan.

Mr. Deegan is proud of his tenure during which he made certain that every student received a first-rate academic education, as well as a solid grounding in their Catholic faith. He and his team faced complex challenges such as the Covid-19 pandemic. Catholic schools of the Archdiocese of New York became national leaders at providing in-person instruction at a time when most school districts remained shuttered. He attributes increases in test scores during this time to the dedicated principals and teachers of the Catholic schools. Among the many accolades he received during his career, the one that has meant the most to him is the Saint Elizabeth Ann Seton Compassionate Educator Award.

"Mike first asked to retire nearly five years ago, but we have been extremely fortunate that he instead agreed to my request that he stay on as superintendent," said Cardinal Dolan. "These past five years have been among the most consequential years for Catholic education, particularly in this archdiocese, and Mike has steadfastly guided us through these difficult years. The legacy that Mike will leave on Catholic education in the Archdiocese of New York is immeasurable. I thank God for his service and wish him and his family a long and happy retirement."

Over Mr. Deegan's time as superintendent, he has worked closely with Inner-City Scholarship Fund. "Inner-City's mission of making a Catholic education possible for underserved students would not be possible without the hardworking educators who deliver a high-quality product that teaches students to be life-long learners and to realize their full potential. Mike has been a committed leader for the schools and will be missed" says Jill Lloyd, Executive Director of Inner-City Scholarship Fund.


