Job Opportunities Program students and volunteers

Job Opportunities Program

The Job Opportunities Program (JOP) gives high school juniors attending inner-city schools in the Archdiocese of New York the opportunity to hone their interview and interpersonal skills and gain experience in a business setting. Students participate in job-readiness workshops that cover essential skills like resume-writing, finances, and office etiquette. They also have the opportunity for paid summer internships at many of New York's most prestigious companies and

One of the organizations that has been especially generous to our JOP students is Haymarket Media (Haymarket). John Crewe, the Data Protection Officer at Haymarket has been involved with Inner-City Scholarship Fund for over 20 years and brought the Job Opportunities Program to Haymarket in 2008 when they hosted their first summer intern.

organizations.

Initially, they were skeptical about placing a high-school-aged intern in their fast-paced environment. That concern quickly dissipated following their first experience with a JOP student. The summer of 2023 will mark the welcoming of Haymarket's 32nd and 33rd JOP interns.

Crewe told us, "Our experience, bar none, has been excellent with every student intern. I like to believe this is a product of the preparation they receive in their school environment and through the workshops."

In two separate instances, JOP interns have returned to Haymarket as full-time employees. Former JOP students, Kwamesha Joseph (2013) and Sabrina Sanchez (2017), now work for Haymarket Media in the medical content and creative editing departments respectively.

We got the chance to talk with Kwamesha. She told us "JOP has been integral to my success. I learned in the program to always do something to set yourself apart, which is how I have now been working at Haymarket Media for over a decade."

Crewe went on to say "We are enthusiastic about our continued partnership with the Job Opportunities Program and want to encourage other companies to participate. The students we have hosted have embodied such hope and aspiration, which has inspired those around them and the teams that have worked with these students each summer."

A Jimmy Lee Scholar Continues to Learn

The "Jimmy Lee Scholars Fund" is an endowment established in memory of longtime Inner-City trustee and supporter, James "Jimmy" B, Lee, Jr. Through the generosity of JPMorgan Chase & Co. and family and friends, this fund provides scholarships for low-income students attending Catholic high schools within the Archdiocese of New York.

The need-based scholarships are awarded to students who meet the program's criteria and have been vetted by the Fund's committee of volunteers. In order to be eligible, students must participate in a school sponsored athletic or extracurricular program and demonstrate a cumulative grade point average of 85 percent or above.

Beyond financial support, the Jimmy Lee Scholars attend panels on different topics such as healthcare, entrepreneurship, and banking. At a career fair set up for students, Jamie Lee, managing partner at Tamarack Global and son of Jimmy Lee, presented on venture capital. After the presentation, an enthusiastic scholarship recipient named Steven Fernandez, approached Jamie with a genuine interest in his presentation and career field and a mutually fruitful connection was born.

After graduating from St. Raymond High School for Boys in 2019, Steven maintained his connection with Jamie throughout college and continued to demonstrate a strong interest in finance. Upon

graduating from college this past spring with a BS in Business Administration from the College of Mount Saint Vincent, Steven asked Jamie for assistance in finding a job and was offered a position at Tamarack Global as a project intern.

This summer, Tamarack Global and Jamie Lee have given Steven a wonderful opportunity to expand not only his resume, but also his business portfolio. He is currently working on an investment memo that requires conducting extensive research on a company that Tamarack might consider investing in or exploring further in the future. The completed project will come about through invaluable business experience and an intimate glimpse into the world of venture capital. "When Steven goes to an interview after this internship, he will have 15 pages of research that looks really good. If somebody presented that to me in an interview, I would find it much more interesting than a resume," said Jamie Lee.

Jamie Lee told us "Inner-City Scholarship Fund has been a big part of my family's philanthropic endeavors for a long time. My dad attributed a lot of his success to his Catholic education, so it was clear to him that Inner-City was the horse he wanted to back. When I was Steven's age, I had every chance to advance my own education. Not everyone is given that opportunity, which is what keeps me and my family invested in Inner-City Scholarship Fund."

The program trains volunteers to teach a six-session mini-course in art appreciation to elementary school students throughout the school year. Learning to Look is designed to give students a comprehensive introduction to art history, beginning with 19th Century European art, and then moving on to American, Old Masters, and Impressionist/Post-Impressionist paintings and sculptures.
