# **Student Spotlight**

Meet Pablo Aguilar - just one of over 9,000 students who attend a Catholic school in the Archdiocese of New York with the support of Inner-City Scholarship Fund. This semester, Pablo, a junior at St. Raymond High School for Boys, was accepted into the prestigious Weill Cornell Medicine Health Professions Recruitment and Exposure Program (HPREP).

HPREP is a nine-week program in which high school sophomores and juniors learn from physicians and other healthcare professionals about their path in the field. The students are paired with a medical student who serves as their mentor to guide them through the college application process, writing a research paper, applying for financial aid, and writing a personal statement.

Pablo's strong desire to work in the medical field comes from his mom, Mrs. Aguilar, who was studying to become a pediatrician in Ecuador before immigrating to the United States. While she was unable to complete her studies, she instilled this same drive in all three of her sons. Pablo's older brothers Julio and Nelson Aguilar both graduated with undergraduate degrees in biology and are both actively applying to medical school.

In addition to the mentors empowering Pablo at home, in school, and in the HPREP program, he receives inspiration from his sponsors, Laurie and Peter Grauer.

Pablo says "I really want to thank Mr. and Mrs. Grauer for all the things they have done for me and my family. The scholarship has really helped take pressure off my parents' back. I have not taken the scholarship for granted. I have applied myself to my studies at St. Raymond's and now, as a junior, I am ranked #2 out of the whole class. Hopefully one day I will be able to give back to inner-city students who are struggling to pay tuition in high school just like Mr. and Mrs. Grauer have done for me."

We wish Pablo the best of luck as he chases his dreams, and we are so thankful for all our sponsors who are helping students on their journey.

### **46th Annual Awards Dinner**

With the help of numerous supporters, Inner-City Scholarship Fund raised over \$1.1 million at the 46th Annual Inner-City Scholarship Fund Awards Dinner honoring Christine and Steve Schwarzman. Hosted by Mo Rocca of CBS Sunday Morning, 350 guests attended the event on November 28 at the Plaza Hotel in Manhattan.

The evening opened with special performances by the choirs of St. Raymond Elementary School, Cardinal Hayes High School, and the Academy of Mount St. Ursula.

His Eminence, Timothy Michael Cardinal Dolan, Archbishop of New York, and Peter T. Grauer, President of Bloomberg Inc., Chairman Emeritus of Bloomberg, L.P., and President of Inner-City Scholarship Fund, presented the 2023 Inner-City Scholarship Fund Award to Stephen A. Schwarzman, Chairman, CEO, and Co-Founder of Blackstone, and Christine Schwarzman, intellectual property attorney, Tony Award-winning producer, and Trustee for Inner-City Scholarship Fund, for their deep and impactful commitment to providing a life-changing Catholic school education to Inner-City students.

Christine Schwarzman thanked everyone for coming to the event and called Inner-City "one of the great, quiet successes of New York." Steve Schwarzman highlighted that "the way we become successful is through education. It is a passport to a better life. Christine and I believe that everybody

### 34th Annual St. Thomas More Award Luncheon

On October 25, the Lawyer's Committee of Inner-City Scholarship Fund honored Stephen J. Brogan, Partner at Jones Day, and Dana L. Mark, Partner at Smith, Gambrell & Russell, LLP, at the 34th Annual Saint Thomas More Award Luncheon at Cipriani 42nd Street in Manhattan.

The annual luncheon welcomed almost 350 guests and raised more than \$930,000 in support of Inner-City's mission to provide scholarship support for underserved Catholic school students in the Archdiocese of New York.

Dana L. Mark was presented with the John P. Cooney Award for Mentorship and Community Involvement. She attended St. Jean Baptiste High School and from that experience, her education became "building blocks for her future endeavors, whether it be academic or going on in life itself." Dana now serves on the board of St. Jean Baptiste and believes in the funding of scholarships because "every young person who wants access to Catholic education should have the opportunity. Through the scholarships, you are opening doors, removing barriers, and giving students an opportunity to show what they can do."

Each year, the Saint Thomas More Award is presented to a member of the legal profession who exemplifies the virtues of St. Thomas More: scholarship, leadership, loyalty to God and country, and service to the legal profession. Stephen J. Brogan embodies these qualities as a partner at

"St. Thomas More is someone who gave his life for his faith, was the top lawyer in the country, and the King would have given him anything he wanted, but his principle carried the day." This example has been a guide to how Brogan has lived and worked. He also thanked the people of Jones Day for their generosity to the event and Inner-City Scholarship Fund.

Yulibeth Aquino, a scholarship recipient and senior at St. Raymond Academy for Girls, spoke about the different ways that Inner-City Scholarship Fund and her *Be A Student's Friend* scholarship are positioning her for success in life. Yulibeth also took part in Inner-City's Job Opportunity Program and was fortunate to be placed at Ashurst Law Firm for an internship. Yulibeth told the audience, "This scholarship has removed an immense amount of pressure from my mother's shoulders, and we are extremely grateful for the assistance it has provided. Knowing there is someone so invested in my success acts as a constant motivator in my life."

# Meet Junior Board Co-Chair, Anna Brennan and her mom

On December 12, Anna, along with fellow cochair, Beau O'Connell traveled to Christ the King School in the Bronx to visit two of the students the Junior Board sponsors annually. These students are supported through funds raised by the Junior Board at their events throughout the year. Anna and Beau were joined by Anna's mom, Patty Brennan, who has a very special family connection to the school. Patty Brennan and six of her siblings attended Christ the King for elementary school. Fun fact; there was one particular school year when Patty and her siblings filled all seven grades, and her mom was working as the reading specialist at the school.

Patty says she and her siblings often reminisce on the size of their classes and how in control their teachers were at Christ the King. "My Catholic school education taught me to be disciplined and do the work. The teachers ingrained in me the basics that you use for the rest of your life. I ended up getting a full scholarship to college and going to law school. I brought those skills (from Christ the King) with me."

Anna Brennan shared that "my mom does not typically reminisce too much about things but when

Anna went on to say "When I joined the Junior Board, I did not know anybody involved and now I consider them all to be friends. It brings you into a group of like-minded people and fosters a good community. Everyone has careers and social lives that they are managing, but it is nice that we can find time for charity in our busy schedules."
